The shells, sticks, & rocks were immediately interesting to the young folk, as were the large chunks of clay.

Each day the children's concept of clay work grows & evolves.

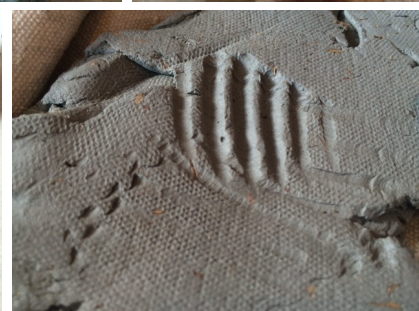


>
