Adhesives with Paper: An Intro to Collaging November 3rd, 2016

After an in-depth experience with different types of glue and tape, the children were offered paper to accompany their glue endeavors. This group of children included two veterans of our last experience: Ruby and Reece, and two older children: Lucas and Aleita, whom I assume have had more experiences with adhesives and the concept of collaging.
