





Collaging with Old Classroom Diaries 7/12/2017

As the 2016-17 school year comes to a close Kalei has been taking time to reflect on our year together while considering & preparing for the future. While filling children's portfolios with the last of this year's diaries she discovered a cache of duplicated or goofed copies. This discovery provoked her to share these extras with a small

group of children in the form of a collage provocation. Would photos inspire reminiscing, a narrative? Have these diaries served as a physical trace of our experiences this year? Might the children be interested in relaunching some of these previous experiences?

Helena queries the origin & function of the material, leading us to a small conversation regarding documentation.

Helena: Hey, why are there copies?

Wren selects photos to collage based on aesthetic appeal, but is very actively engaged in the process of looking.

Wren: Oh! This is a really cool picture!

Wren: Hank, you want to see me? Look at me!

Wren is the first to discuss the element of time in the photos, & begins to remember all kinds of experiences with nostalgia.

Wren: I miss that time we went at that trip at the old school. I'm gonna find that picture.

The prompt of time flows well into a focus on photos of children who have been out of school for summer vacation.

Wren: Helena, I see you! Hank, are you gonna cut me out?

Hank: Only if I can see where your picture is. There's Leo!

Wren: Are you going to cut out Leo? Hank: Well, he was my friend so I *am* gonna cut

him out.

Helena: Well I am just doing ones [pictures] of Cyla because I'm sad she is not at our school anymore.

Hank: I see Julian. I am gonna cut him out.
