

to the right, Noble and Margaret excitedly anticipate the printed reference photos.


below, Margaret explains how we will use these photos to create our drawings.




a little backstory...


but then, Margaret proposes the idea to take photos of the sky and trees to use as reference!



Tashi's fish surrounded by raindrops


"Sometimes on the playground I see ants on the tree. So that's why I decided to put ants on this tree." -Margaret

Each child's take on the experience of drawing by reference was different:

Josie began with a very literal drawing of a car in the parking lot, but as she continued to draw, her drawing contained more and more fantastical and abstract elements. She even personified the car with care to the cooler weather of the day by giving it a "sweater".

Tashi was uninterested in referencing the photo, but felt pressure from Margaret to try to tie in her drawing to the setting of the back yard. She often drew something from her imagination instead.

Noble did not use the reference photo at all, but instead drew an interpretation of his own home.

Margaret kept her drawings very literal. She was especially focused with her pot drawing. Even when she added an element into her drawing from memory (the ants on the tree), she verbally justified it by noting that she had seen ants on other trees in the past.

Sinclair was a late addition to our drawing group, but he did have interest in using the reference photo.

Noble's house
